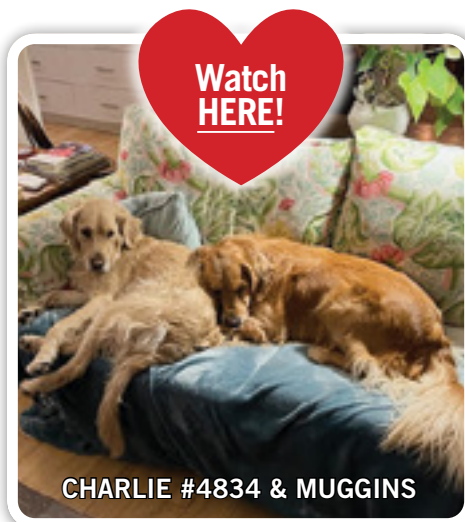

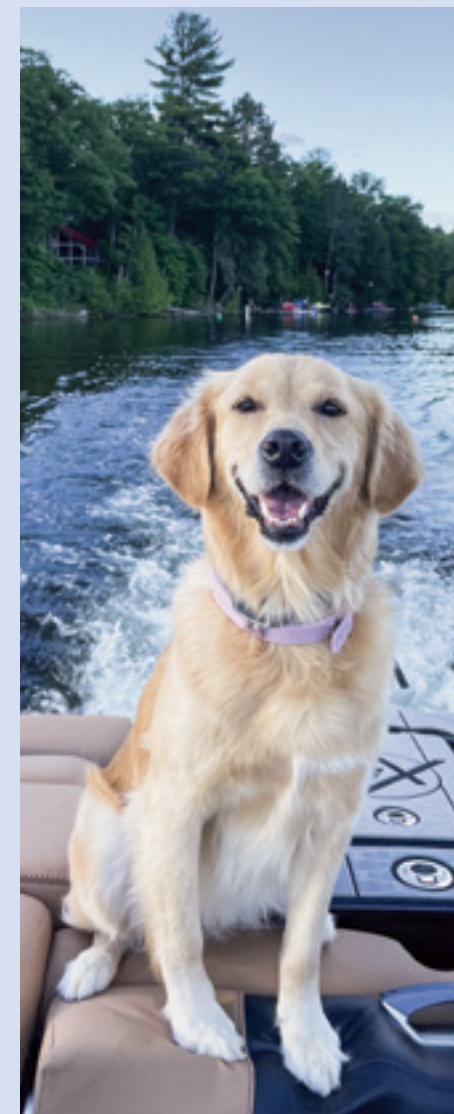

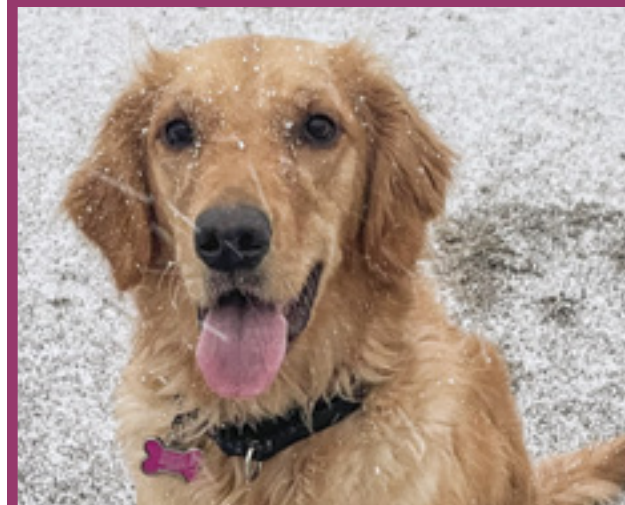


LEE WITH COBIE #2748

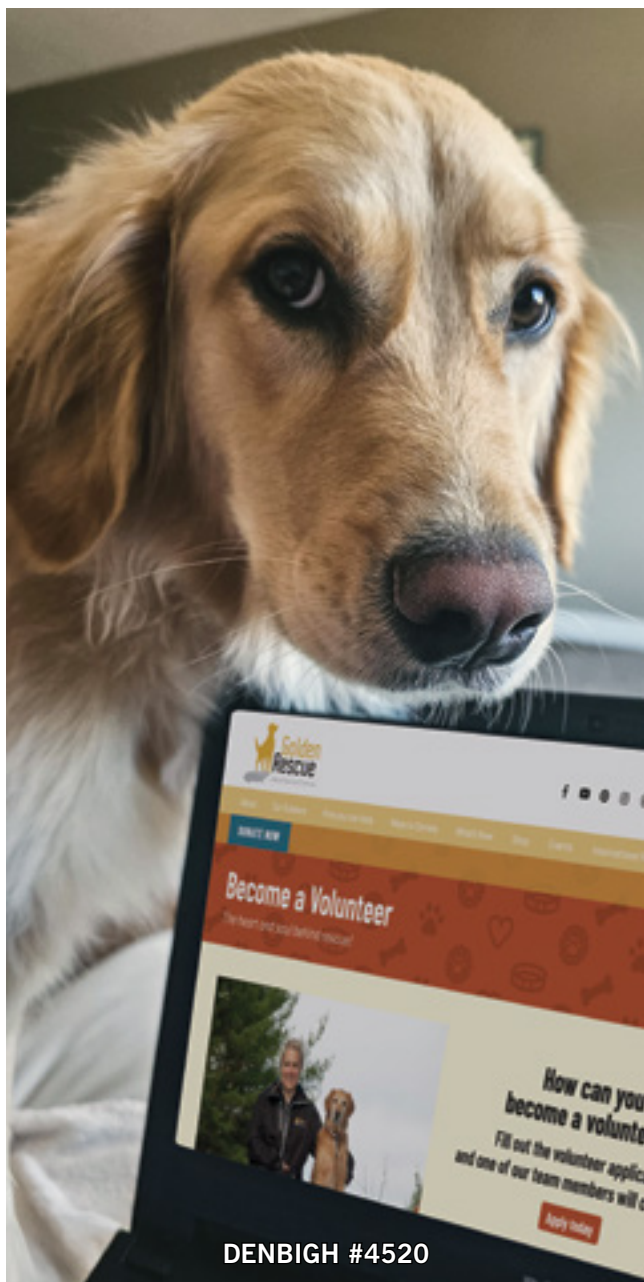
Murphy's INCREDIBLE Journey

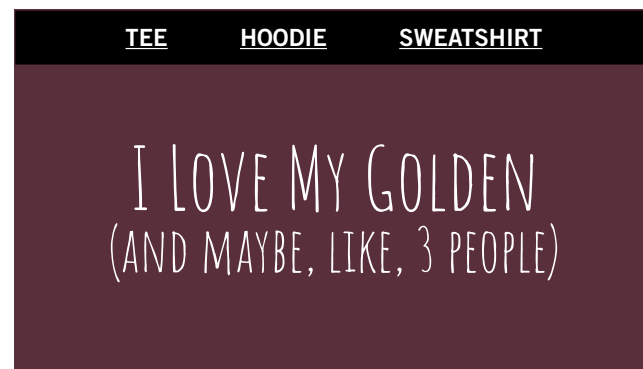

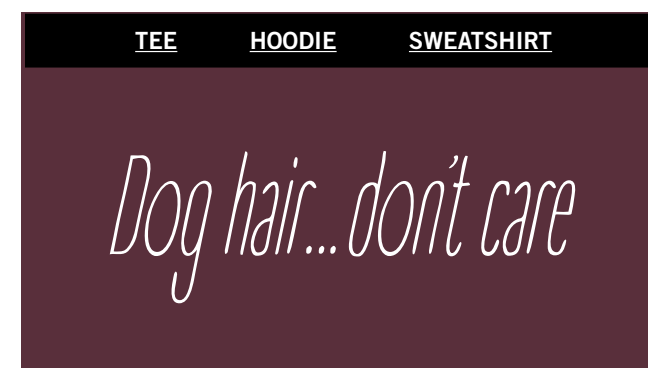
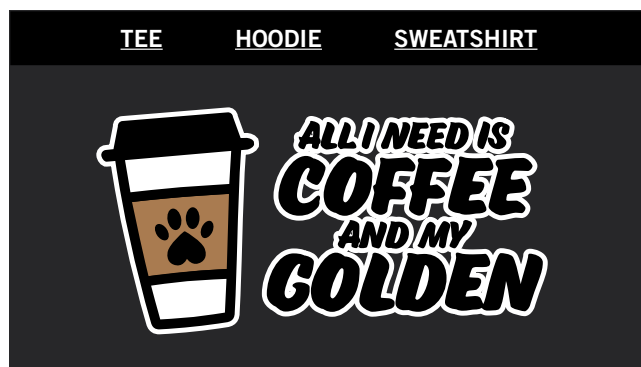

Ask Goldie

Dear Goldie: Remember this...don't give your Golden a stick of gum because you think it's kinda fun. Listen and learn! When my best Golden buddy, Dexter, didn't show up for our daily walkies, mom learned something frightening. The poor boy experienced Xylitol poisoning after eating a few sticks of sugarless gum offered by his owner. Within 30 minutes, he began vomiting followed by incoordination, collapse, and seizures. Luckily, he was taken to the vet immediately and survived. Do you know what happened here? Xavier

Dear Xavier: You've raised an important topic. What seems innocent, can prove deadly. Pet owners need to know the risk of Xylitol poisoning in dogs. Although Xylitol (also known as birch sugar) is safe for people, it is toxic and potentially lethal for dogs in as little as one hour. Xylitol is a common sugar substitute found in some sugarless gum and may appear in toothpaste, sugar substitute, ice cream, peanut butter, and other foods. Thank you for bringing this surprising issue to everyone's attention!

Dear Goldie: I know I'm special and how do I know this? I get more hugs and kisses than anyone in the family. When mom gets home she says "And how's my beautiful boy?". Oldies can display great stability and a calm disposition having been raised by one family since a pup. Steady Eddy is the perfect example of a loving, well-behaved older Golden who now, more than ever, needs a second chance. It's never too late for a new beginning.

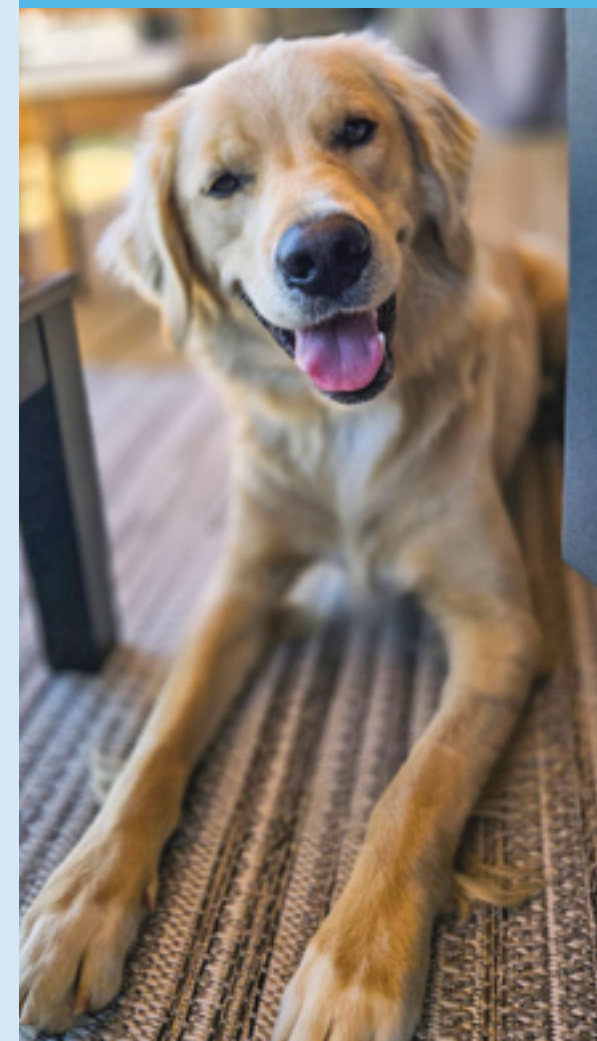
Dear Goldie: Mom wants to start me on raw meat. I'm excited because I do wanna eat like my auntcestrals and be more woof-like, I mean wolf-like. She says it'll mean less poop to scoop. Yes, it's true! My buddy is on BARF, ha-ha, (Bones and Raw Food). Me likes the sound of that too. Goldie, is raw food a pawsitively good idea? Rawnda

Dear Rawnda: Some dogs do better on raw food in the management of gastrointestinal dysfunction, inappetence, obesity or poor coat. However, before starting on raw meat, it would be a good idea for mom to discuss your specific health situation with your vet as 'one size does not fit all'. That way, she can ensure that the diet is complete and well-balanced, while sticking to any additional recommended supplements. And above all, strict safety precautions for you and your family must be taken. Even with the utmost care, the risk of bacteria such as E.coli or salmonella exists.

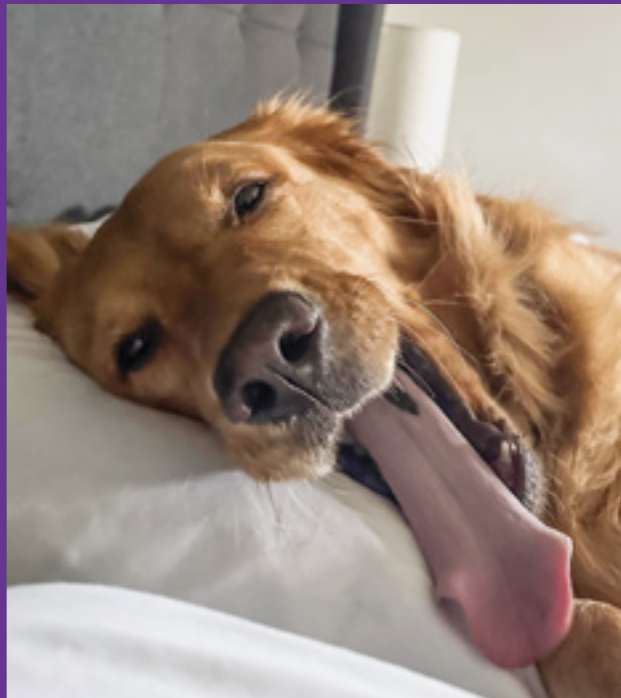

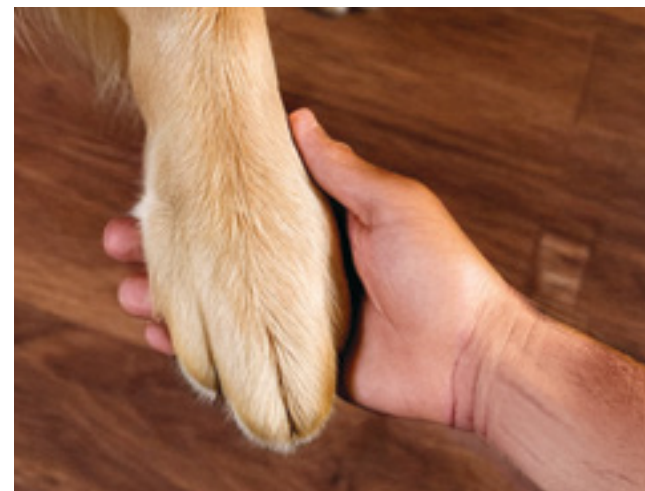
HOME VISITS TEAM

As the saying goes, home is where the heart is ~ especially when there is a Golden in it! And Golden Rescue always wants to make sure that Golden's are going to the best foster or forever home. That is why the Home Visit team is so vital in the fostering and adoption process.

Performing a home visit for a foster or forever family is just one step to ensure we have made the right choice. One of the five home visit team members locates a volunteer near the potential family's home to meet them to ensure the home is a good environment for a Golden. Potential fosters and adopters fill out a comprehensive foster or adoption application and it's important to verify that the information provided is correct or that nothing has changed since the application was submitted. On rare occasions, these visits are done via Zoom; however, it is always preferred to meet the family in person, but in urgent situations or in remote areas, using technology may be the best option.

The home visit volunteer will have a template containing the information about the home and the family to review during their visit. This information is sent back to the foster or placement team and if all is well, the foster or adoption process can proceed.

As simple as this sounds, it requires a great deal of organization. Home visits are usually completed within a couple of days of the request, so it is important that the volunteers are on top of their emails and have a system in place to keep track of



all of the requested visits, as well as for sending information back to the appropriate team.

You may remember the August 2025 issue of The Guardian, where we introduced you to the transportation team, that situations happen, such as the rescue of 25 Golden's from Manitoba whereby the team needed to coordinate and move quickly to find fosters or forever families for these Golden's. Fortunately, Golden Rescue volunteers are always ready to step up! No matter the challenge, the team is dedicated to getting Golden's into safe, loving fosters or forever families.

As one volunteer put it "the difficult we can do immediately; the impossible will take a little longer". Few things are ever impossible with our volunteers when it comes to caring for our Golden's!
