


LOUISE PENNY to the RESCUE




DAISY MAE #2767

horse tack shop (usually \$6 - \$20). In your case, you don't want the modified Dog Curry Comb styles sold at pet stores in various colours and styles. You want the original Equine Curry Comb made of rubber which has very short nubs. It is used on your back and sides in slow, circular motions. I have not met a dog yet who hasn't loved it. I hope you're not the first. Gentle circles over those hair tufts and burrs and they're gone... works like magic.

Dear Goldie: I'm one of those quickie Goldens. You know, whatever food falls on the kitchen floor is mine...no questions asked. It's a race to be first and I always win. The other day when mom was making a salad, two grapes rolled across the floor and I nailed them...ummmm tasted so good! Mom went ballistic shouting at me to drop them. She contacted our vet for further direction. Luckily, I had only devoured one. Does this mean that I can never eat another grape ever? Trigger

BEHIND-THE-SCENES AT GOLDEN RESCUE

ADMINISTRATION ~ BOARD OF DIRECTORS, TREASURY, DATABASE & THE GR STORE

As the saying goes, home is where the heart is ~ especially when there is a Golden in it! And Golden Rescue always wants to make sure that Goldens are going to the best foster or forever home. That is why the Home Visit team is so vital in the fostering and adoption process.

Performing a home visit for a foster or forever family is just one step to ensure we have made the right choice. One of the five home visit team members locates a volunteer near the potential family's home to meet them to ensure the home is a good environment for a Golden. Potential fosters and adopters fill out a comprehensive foster or adoption application and it's important to verify that the information provided is correct or that nothing has changed since the application was submitted. On rare occasions, these visits are done via Zoom; however, it is always preferred to meet the family in person, but in urgent situations or in remote areas, using technology may be the best option.

The home visit volunteer will have a template containing the information about the home and the family to review during their visit. This information is sent back to the foster or placement team and if all is well, the foster or adoption process can proceed.

As simple as this sounds, it requires a great deal of organization. Home visits are usually completed within a couple of days of the request, so it is important that the volunteers are on top of their emails and have a system in place to keep track of all of the requested visits, as well as for sending information back to the appropriate team.

You may remember the August 2025 issue of The Guardian, where we introduced you to the transportation team, that situations happen, such as the rescue of 25 Goldens from Manitoba whereby the team needed to coordinate and move quickly to find fosters or forever families for these Goldens.

Fortunately, Golden Rescue volunteers are always ready to step up! No matter the challenge, the team is dedicated to getting Goldens into safe, loving fosters or forever families.

As one volunteer put it “the difficult we can do immediately; the impossible will take a little longer”. Few things are ever impossible with our volunteers when it comes to caring for our Goldens!


**Enrique #3118**
