Sometimes when a pet parent says "Who did that?" their Golden retriever will immediately roll over on their back to accept blame, as in "Busted...it was me who barfed on the carpet!".

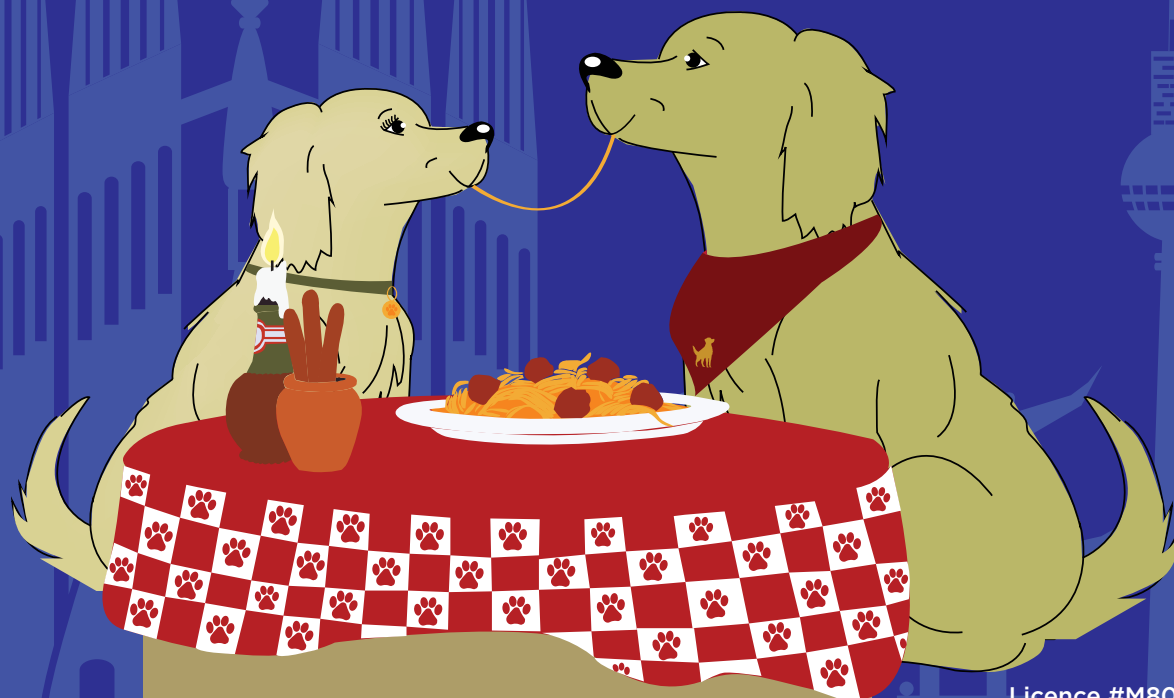

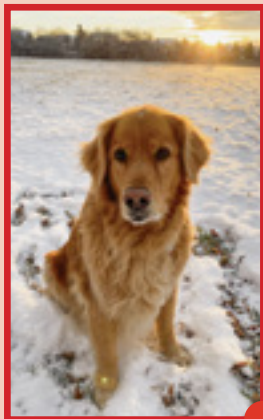

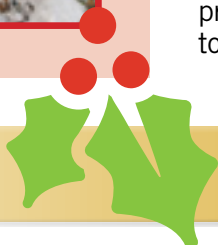
Meet an outstanding volunteer ~ a golden angel with a golden heart!

Through Golden Rescue's social media team, the opportunity to learn about rescue and find a family is easier than ever. Gone are the days of finding a pup to adopt in the Pennysaver (did we just age ourselves?) ~ now we have a plethora of online platforms to spread the word, and Golden Rescue has dedicated, creative volunteers to manage the ever-growing world of social media.

Social media (or digital media) is so much more than a quick Facebook post of a cute Golden. Our volunteers create content related to outreach, fundraising, awareness, and adoptions using graphics, videos, and words to advertise what Golden Rescue does and how people can get involved. our Goldens ready for adoption and our initiative is to respond to posts within two hours.

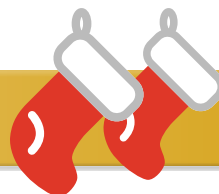

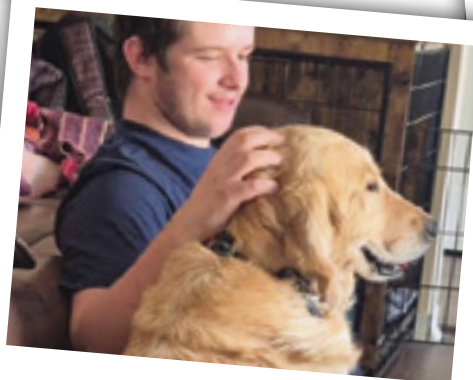

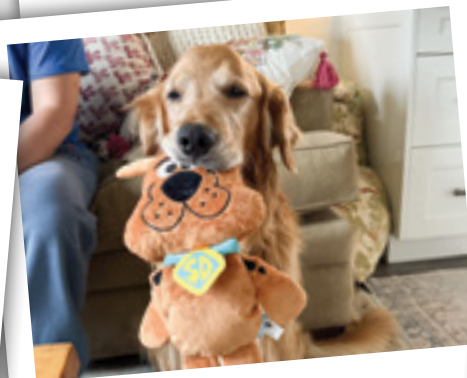
