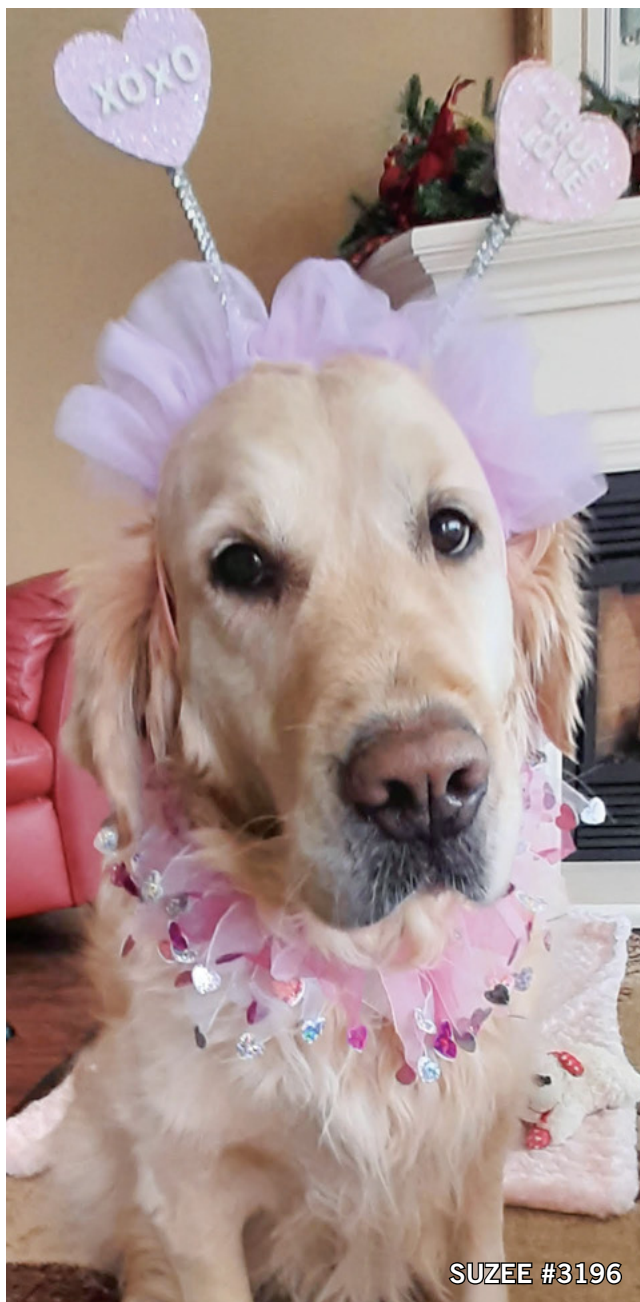

# Golden Rescue's Scholarship for Canine Oncology Research

For some time, the Golden Rescue board has been considering how we could meaningfully show our deep appreciation to the veterinary community. Our supporting vets have literally made it possible for us to continue the expensive work of rescue for over 30 years by providing free services and discounts and generally being advocates for rescue. By way of paying-it-forward and to help promote animal welfare, we have created a scholarship for veterinary students at the Ontario Veterinary College (University of Guelph). The \$5,000 scholarship will be awarded each year for five years to students working in research for canine oncology. Cancer is the number one killer of Golden Retrievers with over 60% of our beloved Goldens succumbing to this horrible disease. Our gift will help advance innovative treatments, improve patient care, and strengthen the foundation of veterinary oncology.

We would like to thank the Dean of the Ontario Veterinary College, Dr. Jeff Wichtel and our Golden Rescue Board Member, Dr. Patty Lechten, for guiding us through the process to make this scholarship possible.

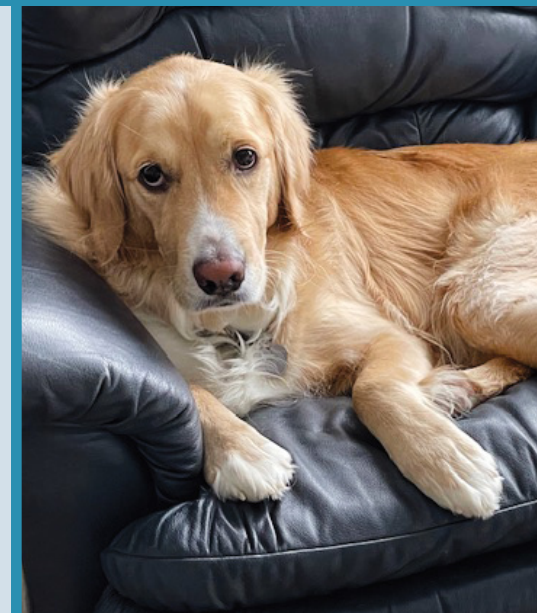


## MEET & GREET

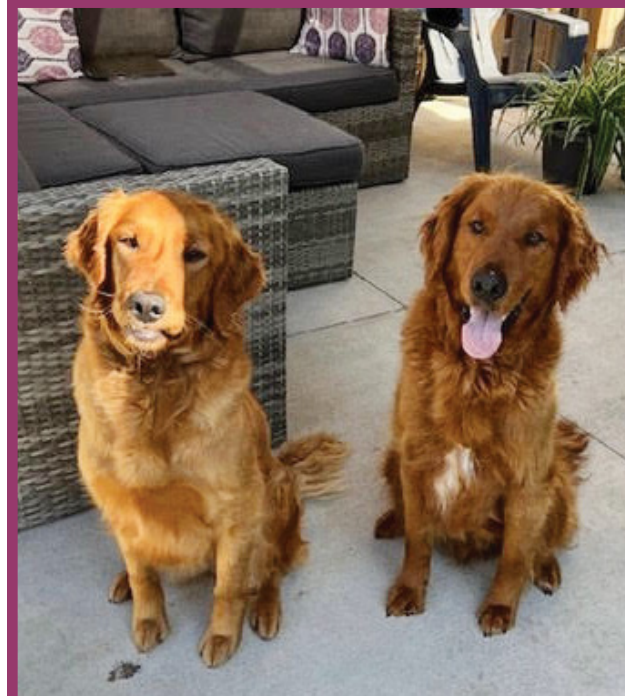
## MEET & GREET

## BEHIND-THE-SCENES AT GOLDEN RESCUE EVENTS

What could be better than a stroll through a farmer's market, enjoying the fresh delights of the land? How about one where you also get to pet an adorable Golden and chat with a friendly volunteer? The Golden Rescue events team is hard at work, year-round, bringing events to the community to raise awareness about Golden Rescue's mission and provide education to fellow Golden lovers.

The farmer's market is just one example of the approximately 30 events per year held across the country. There are movie theatres, festivals, Pawloozas, and many ad-hoc events that our dedicated volunteers organize and run. These events serve to educate the public about what Golden Rescue does and how they can help. People are often surprised to find out that there is an entire organization dedicated to one of the most popular dog breeds ~ it is enlightening for many to learn that rescue is needed for so many reasons.

Our 20+ events volunteers are very organized, dependable, and good communicators, some of whom are blessed with one of our Golden retrievers and others who are supporters of our mission. Of course, having a Golden with us at an event is an instant draw ~ who can resist those wagging tails and goofy smiles? But it's not a requirement to bring your own Golden! All you need is a shared love of Golden retrievers, a couple of hours, and a willingness to share information with fellow dog-lovers. Volunteers work in shifts and always have support from Golden Rescue throughout the day.

When an event is coming up, our Event Volunteer Coordinators get to work finding local volunteers who are available and willing to attend the event. They work out a schedule ensuring there is coverage for the duration and help answer any volunteer questions. The Event Coordinator manages all of the logistics and materials needed for a successful event and runs a Zoom prep call for all event volunteers to ensure they are comfortable and ready. After the event, they send any collected donations or sign-ups (for volunteering and our mailing list) to the treasury and volunteer teams.

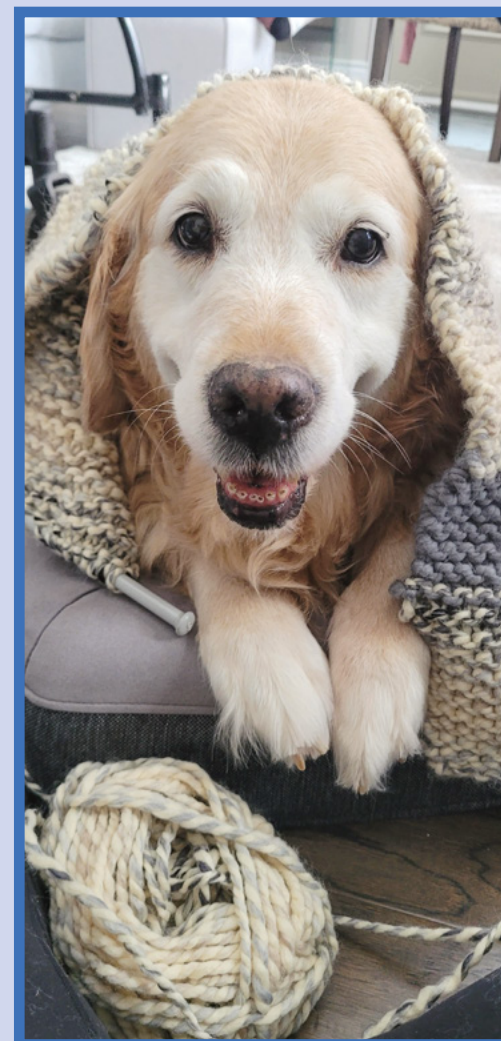

### Lucy #3856

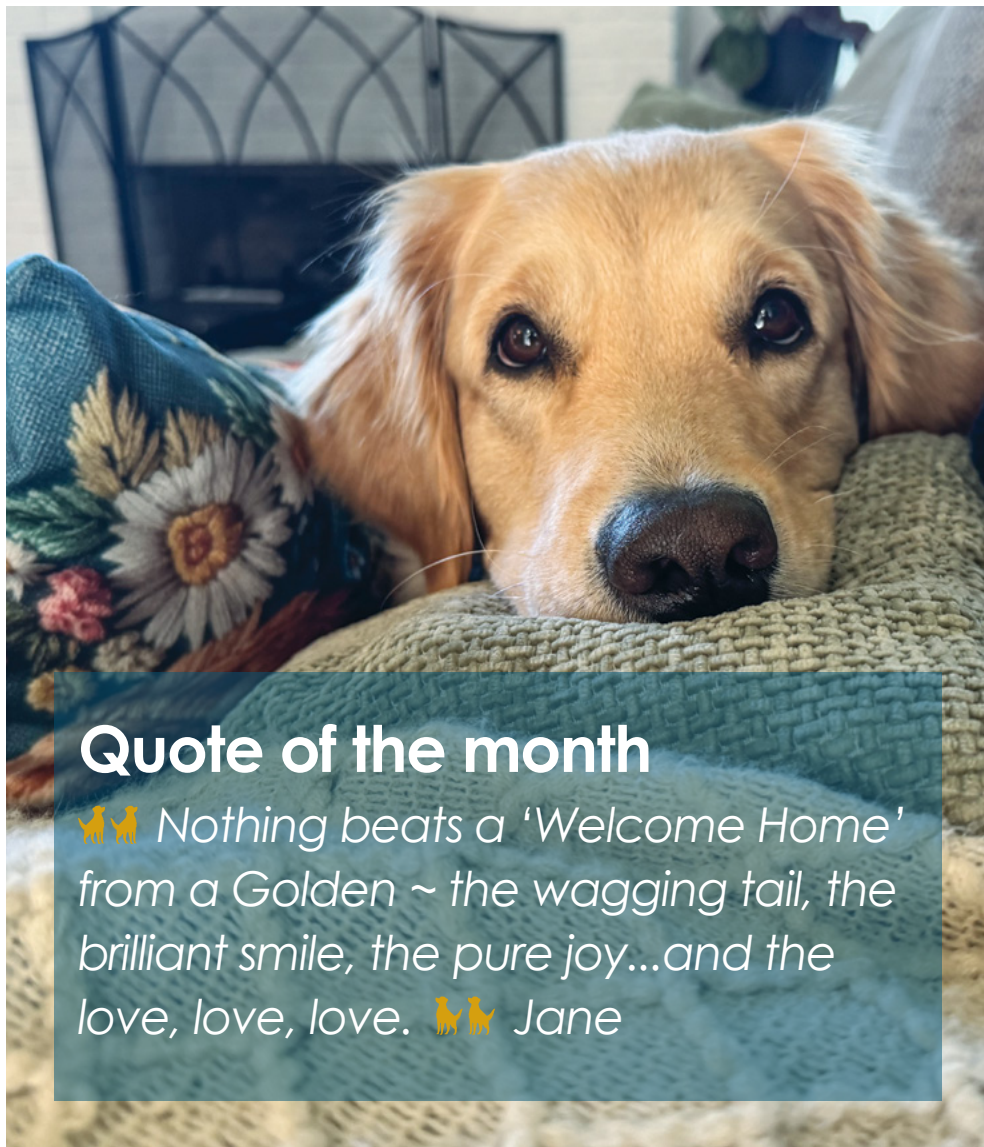

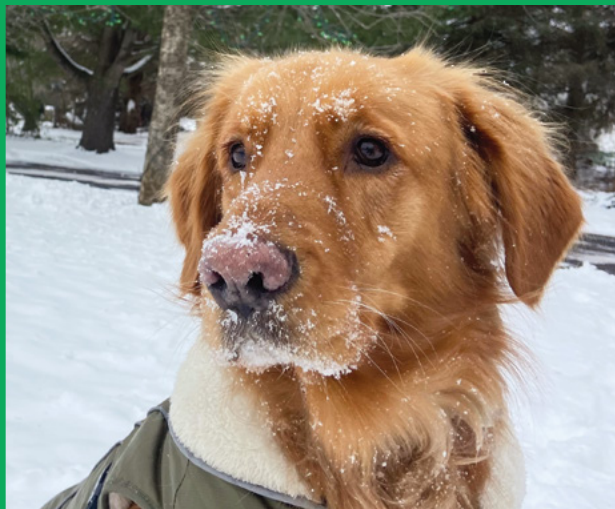


HARPER #3608

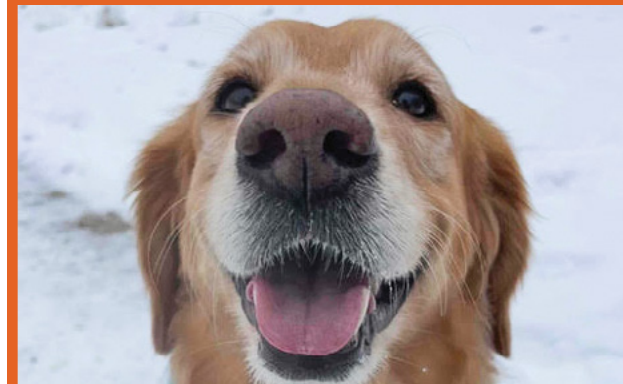


BENTLEY #3815

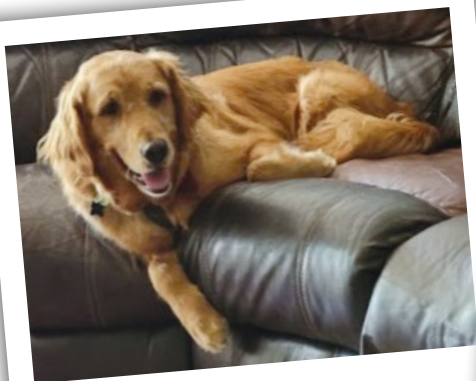
DAISY #3640

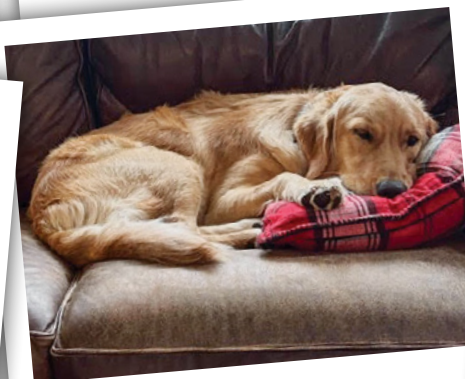
